#### **KIRTLAND AIRMAN ARRAIGNED ON FEDERAL CHILD PORNOGRAPHY CHARGES**

**Henry Jager**, 33, a United States Air Force Staff Sergeant stationed at Kirtland Air Force Base and resident of Albuquerque, was arraigned this morning by Chief United States Magistrate Judge Richard L. Puglisi on a two-count federal indictment charging him with possession of child pornography. Jager was arrested on June 1, 2010 at Kirtland Air Force Base. Jager faces up to 10 years imprisonment, up to a life-time of supervised release and a \$250,000 fine for each count of possession of a visual depiction of a minor engaged in sexually explicit conduct.

United States Attorney Kenneth J. Gonzales said that the charges against Jager stem from a 2009 investigation by the Albuquerque Immigration and Customs Enforcement and the United States Air Force Office of Special Investigations. The case is being prosecuted by Charlyn Rees, Assistant United States Attorney, as part of the national Project Safe Childhood Initiative. Project Safe Childhood marshals federal,

state and local resources to better locate, apprehend and prosecute individuals who exploit children via the Internet, as well as to identify and rescue victims.

An indictment is only an accusation. All criminal defendants are presumed innocent until proven guilty beyond a reasonable doubt.
